Whether that be through personal preference, through waiting lists elsewhere, or simply not being able to access support due to a financial barrier, we've seen people from all walks of life reach out and ask for a hand.

Despite it being hard going and sometimes tough knowing that there's so many people needing support, it's been beyond comforting knowing that through bringing in extra counselling hours, providing more services and being on the brink of extending our service even more, we've been able to work and manage the ever growing demand with thanks to so many fantastic supports.

This month in particular, we'd like to raise and highlight the importance of two fantastic fundraising efforts in particular that have allowed us to increase the number of slot's we've been able to open up and pay for people to access support.
